





PATERSON'S GREAT FALLS

Paterson's early inhabitants were the Lenape. They lived in villages along the river.




PICNIC AT THE GREAT FALLS
On July 10, 1778, George Washington, Alexander Hamilton and other military staff visited the Great Falls.




S.U.M. SEAL


The private corporation that created Paterson, America's first planned industrial city.

THE WATERWHEEL


Early factories depended on the waterwheel, which turned water into power.




John Ryle was the first to spin silk onto bobbins here in 1840.




SILK CITY

COMPLETION OF THE TRANSCONTINENTAL RAILROAD Paterson built, Engine No. 119 was used to celebrate this achievement in 1869.




THE UNDERGROUND RAILROAD

Escaping slaves could find food and shelter in Paterson on their way North to freedom.




A CITY OF IMMIGRANTS

People from many countries came to live and work in Paterson.




In the center of Downtown, City Hall is the hub of our city government.




LAMBERT CASTLE

Striking was one way workers could improve conditions in the mills.




MEMORIAL DAY NURSERY

Jennie Tuttle Hobart presented this new, larger building in memory of her daughter Fanny.




HOLLAND SUBMARINE


John P. Holland, a Paterson school teacher, invented the modern submarine and tested it in the Passaic River.

powered by a Paterson built Whirlwind engine.




This artist created over 40 public sculptures still seen in Paterson today.




THE SILK CITY DINER

The Silk City Diner was manufactured by the Paterson Vehicle Company.





HINCHLIFFE STADIUM

From 1945-1950, the stadium was the home of midget car racing.




PATERSON'S POETS


THE PATERSON MUSEUM

Paterson is one of the richest mineralized basalt areas in the world.




LOU COSTELLO (1906-1959)
