Program Description

Batter Up is an interactive baseball program introducing students to the life and career of Larry Doby; the first Black baseball player in the American Leagues. In this program, students will analyze objects, photographs, and news clippings on Paterson's own, Larry Doby as they discover details about his life as a barrier-breaking Major League Baseball player. Participants will present their discoveries and conclude the program with a game of trivia baseball.

Location Requirement

Students will need access to an area suitable for a game of baseball i.e.: gym, playground, open space outdoors, etc.
