Program Description

Lenapehoking is an immersive educational escape room experience that takes participants back in time to the world of the Lenape people between 1100 and 1500. Through interactive challenges, participants will uncover key facts about Lenape culture, discover hidden clues, and solve engaging puzzles to "escape" the game. This program also features hands-on artifact exploration, a guided tour of our Lenape exhibit, and concludes with a fun trivia bingo session to reinforce the knowledge gained throughout the experience.
